Mr Kenneth Francis Barwise, MM, CD passed away on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of March 2008.

Ken, a Veteran of Korea served with the Second Battalion during and after the Korean War. Private Barwise was awarded the Military Medal for his "outstanding courage" at the Battle of Kapyong. Ken was credited with killing six enemy at night at very close range. Later in the morning Ken re-captured one Vickers Machine Gun and despite enemy small arms fire brought the gun into action. Later the same morning, Ken volunteered to carry ammunition forward, during the afternoon, Ken led a party of ammunition bearers and stretcher bearers forward and assisted in evacuation of the wounded while under enemy fire. Ken's bravery and complete disregard for personal safety under fire was an inspiration to his comrades and contributed largely to the successful and the gallant stand made by the Second Battalion at Kapyong.
